## Damenchor Notes

Our Damenchor had a very busy 2018! In preparation for our District Songfest, our Damenchor purchased Dirndls (German dresses). We look so authentic! I want to thank the people that made donations, since they are not cheap. We organized and hosted the 64<sup>th</sup> Bezirkssaengerfest (District Singing Fest) in Indianapolis on April 13-15. On Friday, the "Welcoming" was held at the Liederkrantz with a dinner and dance. Our Hauptkonzert (main concert) was held on Saturday at the Grand Hall at Union Station. We had over 200 singers from Ohio, Kentucky, Illinois and Indiana. On the following day, the Fruehschoppen for all the singers was held at the Illinois Ballroom at Union Station. Every choir sang separately after the luncheon. After that, we said goodbye to friends we see every year at the different Saengerfests. We received many compliments on our first District Songfest!

Our yearly Maifest and Bunter Abend events went really well, with a dinner, concert and dance. I think our audience enjoys our singing and our food! At the beginning of September, we helped in the cake booth at the Octoberfest at German Park. We had a lot of rain that weekend. In October, the German Consulate in Chicago decided to start "The Year of German/American Friendship" with the theme "Wunderbar Together" in Indianapolis the weekend of October 6. Our choir (along with our men's choir) sang at a German service at Zion Evangelical Church. After the service, we participated in the German Parade from Monument Circle to the Anthaneum. In December, Sacred Heart invited us to sing at their St. Nickolaus Fest. In addition, this was the second year that we were asked to sing at the "Christkindlmarkt" in Carmel, and we sang on two different weekends. Together with the men and our Bell Choir, we held our favorite event – our Weihnachtskonzert (Christmas Concert). I think we sound awesome together!

Last but not least, I want to invite all ladies that like to sing to join our choir. We love having new singers join our choir! If you don't know German, then we will help you to pronounce the words. We practice on Wednesday at 7:15 p.m. I hope to see many of you for practice, and you'll get to wear a Dirndl at our concerts.
