I have spoken with them, and they let me know that they will keep us in mind and explain the situation to whoever purchases their property so that we can speak with them when the property is sold. However, the possibility still exists that the new owner would have need of that space or wants to re-sell it at a price that would be prohibitive to us. We will try to prepare for whatever we encounter, but there is no question that we will have to cross that bridge in the next two or three years.

My first experience at the Liederkrantz was in 1974 when I was asked to play the keyboard in Ed Miller's German Band---the "house band" of the Liederkrantz. I learned hundreds of German songs in that band, which served me very well six years later---when I was asked to become the Men's Choir Director. It's been quite a journey! I began by organizing the un-alphabetized (and very messy) music library, adding more singers, and new music. Next came the Damenchor, the Cabarets, the Weihnachtskonzerts, the Brass Band, and the Bell choir. Throughout that whole musical journey.....something else happened to me: I fell in love with the Liederkrantz AND our building. Back in 1974, it looked very different than it does now. When I would inquire about making some improvements, I often heard this: "Well....we're probably not going to be here that much longer." I was stunned!

In 2002, we began with our Cabaret Series, and I decided to paint the two little dressing rooms at the sides of the stage---so that the performers could change their clothes in there. Margit Ball helped me paint---and after that there was no stopping us. Next we painted the Kranz, the little Hallway, the Lobby, the Coatroom, the Front and Backsides of our building (making it more German-looking), parts of the Bar, the Elevator Shaft, the West Staircase, and, lately, a large storage area in our basement. (Yes, there IS a basement.) ☺

I'm so proud of the Liederkrantz--that we are alive and well, even in our 146th year, and I firmly believe that we ARE going to be here "that much longer." Many people---men and women---have joined in to help us, and given of their time, their expertise, and their money. (Think of Horst and Helga Michaelis' major remodel of the whole 2nd floor! Think of our Wednesday afternoon work crew!) We're not done yet!

The New Year brings with it our annual membership drive. We'd love to have you back with us in 2018! I understand that we used to have about 250 annual memberships. Last year, our membership was 140 members (this includes family as two and singles) plus our six lifetime members in 2017. Our numbers for last year could have been higher if some of the active singers had remembered to submit their memberships. Check your wallet, do you have a 2017 membership card? We have been able this past year to improve our building outside with new walk ways (\$5,000) and new siding on east and west sides (\$30,000). Also, we're considering improvements to the lobby and "Krantz" room, and these major expenses have been paid with funds generously donated. Membership dues along with funds earned through concerts and special events pay for those continuing expenses such as heat, lights, water, phone, liquor license and our director. **More importantly**, your dues help fund the very existence of our **Liederkrantz** and its mission of preserving German culture thru song in the Indianapolis area.

A membership form is provided for your convenience as a part of this newsletter. Please mail the completed form, along with a check for your dues/donation, to the address shown on the form. If your dues are paid or postmarked by the end of February, you can designate a free membership for 2018 for a new member, provided they have not been a member for the last three years.

Please also consider a tax-deductible donation over-and-above the membership dues. We now have a 501(c)(3) tax status, which makes your donation tax-deductible if you itemize deductions.
